



Supportive Housing

What is supportive housing?

This is a recovery-based service that combines support with housing to promote successful tenancies. It is a collaborative partnership with:

- Stonehenge Therapeutic Community
- Waterloo Regional Homes for Mental Health Inc.
- Dunara Homes for Recovery Inc.
- The County of Wellington; and
- Private landlords, offering safe, subsidized, longer term and transitional housing options across Guelph and Wellington.

Who can access supportive housing?

Individuals 18 years of age and older who:

- Are experiencing homelessness or are a risk of losing their housing
- Are experiencing significant mental health and/or addiction issues
- Qualify for subsidized/geared-to-income rent (financially vulnerable)
- Are in need of and willing to engage with a Support Worker on a regular and on-going basis
- Are able to live independently with minimal supports

In addition to the above, for transitional addiction supportive housing (ASH), applicants will have participated in a residential or community addictions treatment program within the last 3 months and be striving to maintain abstinence.
